ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OPEN AIR CAMPAIGNERS, INC.

Pursuant to R.S. 15:1-14, Open Air Campaigners, Inc., a non-profit corporation of the State of New Jersey, pursuant to a resolution duly adopted by its Board of Trustees resolving that it is advisable to change its name and the name and address of its registered agent, and to make several other changes in its Certificate of Incorporation, does hereby restate its Certificate of Incorporation in the manner following:

FIRST: The name by which this corporation is to be known is
OPEN AIR CAMPAIGNERS, U.S., INC.

SECOND: The corporation is organized as a religious society pursuant to Section 15:1-21 of "The Corporations and Associations Not for Profit Act" of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey and shall be operated exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and its purposes shall be as follows:

A. To seek to lead men and women and children to a saving faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and to help and encourage them in the service of God by:

1. Preaching the gospel and the need of true conversion and holiness of heart and life, by means of Gospel Motor Vehicles and other means, in the open air and wherever the opportunity occurs to witness for Christ.

2. Promoting and conducting special evangelistic and other services and public and private meetings and gatherings.

3. Cooperating with all doctrinally sound Christian Churches; and acting as liaison between such persons as may be led to a saving faith in our Lord Jesus Christ by the activities of the Corporation and the various Christian Churches so that such persons may become members and workers in any one or more of the said Churches.

4. Promoting the association together of children and young people and others for systematic Bible reading and study of the Scripture.

5. Training workers to become efficient open-air workers, personal workers, evangelists, preachers and teachers.

6. Producing and distributing evangelistic, religious and other literature in connection with the aforesaid services or otherwise, but only in connection with the purposes of the Corporation.

B. To establish, acquire and operate all types of educational, recreational, religious and other facilities, but only in connection with the other purposes of the Corporation.

C. To provide gratuitously or otherwise for the training of teachers and assistants in any activity carried on by the Corporation.

D. To establish and carry on art, craft and industrial training centers for young people for the purpose of teaching all manner of arts, crafts and industries, as an adjunct to and means of performing the foregoing purposes of the Corporation.

E. To establish and maintain libraries and to provide and acquire for them or for libraries otherwise established, copies of books, magazines or publications of any description whatever in connection with the other purposes of the Corporation.

F. To receive donations and contributions to the funds of the Corporation, and to accept or refuse any gift, subscription, donation, endowment or bequest made to or acquired by the Corporation generally, for the objects herein set forth, or for the purpose of any specific object not in conflict with the purposes herein set forth, and to undertake, execute and carry out any charitable or other trusts which may seem conducive to the objects of the Corporation.

THIRD: As a means of accomplishing the foregoing purposes, the corporation shall have the following powers:

A. To solicit and receive contributions, donations, bequests and devises of real or personal property;

B. To make contributions, grants, loans, guarantees and other payments of money and extensions of credit to any organization, public or private, or individual;

C. To make and perform contracts and incur liabilities;

D. To delegate functions, conduct its activities through other organizations and individuals and to become a member of any committee or other organization;

E. To accept, acquire, receive, take and hold by bequest, devise, grant, purchase, gift, exchange, lease, transfer, judicial order or decree, or otherwise, for any of its objects and purposes, any property, both real and personal, of whatever kind, nature, or description and wherever situated;

F. To sell, exchange, convey, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of, any such property both real and personal, as the objects and purposes of the corporation may require, subject to such limitations as may be prescribed by law or this certificate of incorporation;

G. To borrow money, and from time to time, to make, accept, endorse, execute, and issue bonds, debentures, promissory notes, bills of exchange, and other obligations of the corporation for moneys borrowed or in payment of corporation, and to secure the payment of any obligations by mortgage, pledge, deed, indenture, agreement, or other instrument of trust, or by other lien upon, assignment of, or agreement in regard to all or any part of the property, rights or privileges of the corporation wherever situated, whether now owned or hereafter to be acquired;

H. To invest and reinvest its funds in such common or preferred, bonds, debentures, mortgages, or in such other securities and property as its Board of Trustees shall deem advisable, subject to the limitations and conditions contained in any bequest, devise, grant, or gift, provided such limitations and conditions are not in conflict with the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;

I. In general, and subject to such limitations and conditions as are or may be prescribed by law, to exercise such other powers which now are or hereafter may be conferred by law upon a corporation organized for the purposes herein-above set forth, or necessary or incidental to the powers so conferred, or conducive to the attainment of the purposes of the corporation, subject to the further limitation and condition that, notwithstanding any other provision of this certificate, only such powers shall be exercised as are in furtherance of the tax-exempt purpose of the corporation and as may be exercised by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2), Section 2055(a)(2), and Section 2522(a)(2) of such Code.

FOURTH: The following provisions shall govern the organization, operation and dissolution of the corporation:

A. The corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor shall it directly or indirectly engage in any activity, that would (a) prevent it from obtaining exemption from federal income taxation as a corporation described in Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or (b) cause it to lose such exempt status;

B. The corporation shall not be operated for the purpose of carrying on a trade or business for profit;

C. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, officer of the corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and no member, trustee, officer of the corporation, or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporation assets on dissolution of the corporation;

D. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or other-wise attempting, to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office;

E. Notwithstanding any other provision of this certificate, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2), Section 2055(a)(2), and Section 2522(a)(2) of such Code;

F. Upon the dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, literary, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

FIFTH: For purposes of this certificate references to provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 shall be deemed to refer to the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954 and Regulations pursuant thereto, and shall also be deemed to include statutes and Regulations which supersede such provisions.

SIXTH: The membership of the corporation shall be the Trustees of the corporation.

SEVENTH: The place in which the operations of the corporation are principally to be conducted is the State of New Jersey, but the operations of the corporation shall not be limited to such territory.

EIGHTH: The number of Trustees of the corporation shall be as specified by the by-laws of the corporation.
